

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice. Let your reasonableness be known to everyone. The Lord is at hand; do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God (Philippians 4:4–6).

I have to be honest — this position has caused me some anxiety. Just when I think I have all my ducks in a row, another one comes quacking at me from left field! This article is one example. I have known about the deadline for months and have come up with (and rejected) several topics. I finally reread my first article to see exactly where I had ended. In it I asked you to pray for the new Executive Committee so that we could move forward together in service to God and to you. Then I googled the top 100 Bible verses on moving forward and Philippians 4:6 appeared on that list. And then, like every good Lutheran catechism student, I looked it up in the Bible so I could read what came before and after to be sure that I didn't take it out of context. The last half of verse 5 jumped out at me, The Lord is at hand; and verse 7, And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. It was like a light bulb for me! Yes there are things I forget to do (thank goodness I am surrounded by an excellent team that reminds me gently!), and yes there are deadlines that I miss (so that I can extend grace to others for doing the same thing!), but we are still moving forward because the Lord IS at hand and His peace is ours through Christ Jesus.

God's hand is in all that has been accomplished so far. The District Board of Directors selected a Day of Prayer offering recipient for 2025–2026 (read more about it on page 3). They approved a theme, verse, and goal statement (see page 2) for the 2026 LWML Kansas District Convention, as well as convention chairmen: Gayle Grimm, Manhattan Zone, Chairman; Darla Abbott, Hutchinson Zone, Co-chairman; Mary Bowen, Northwest Zone, Co-chairman; and Marcia Ricke, Southwest Zone, Co-chairman. They approved the design, to the right, for the logo that will appear on t-shirts and convention paperwork, either in black and white, as it is here, or possibly in color (still in development stages). I will call for an actual banner design for the District Convention in Spring 2025 so be thinking about what you would like to submit!

COUNSELOR'S CORNER

The season of fall is upon us. With it comes cooler temperatures, smells of apple cider and pumpkin coffees, well pumpkin anything, these days, and the changing leaves on the trees. A year ago, my wife and I took a bucket list vacation and visited the New England states in October to explore and witness the fall colors. It was a great getaway, even though all the local people kept telling us that the colors were not as vibrant as they normally are, and that they weren't much to see. For us Kansas people, they were quite amazing, and it was a wonderful relaxing time. While here in Kansas we may not experience New England color change, we do get amazing glimpses of God's creation and the changing of the season. It seems that there is always something changing or going in and out of season. God tells Noah in Genesis 8:22, "While the earth remains, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night, shall not cease." So, we can expect there to be a changing of seasons, and the earth will continue its cycling that God has established and that He is LORD over, until His right time to change them and make it new.

As we think upon God's forbearance over the earth and all things, changing of time and seasons do not just happen to the earth. We, too, go through seasons and changes in our lives. - The appointment is for two years, ending at the completion of the District Convention. Committee members are eligible for one consecutive reappointment to the same committee.
- Committee members help plan and attend the annual Kansas Assembly of Leaders (KAOL).
- Committee members are expected to attend the District Convention in the spring of even-numbered years. A full schedule of responsibilities keeps committee personnel very busy before and during the convention.
- Standing Committee Chairmen are members of the Board of Directors (BOD) and attend BOD meetings once or twice a year (just prior to the convention and at the KAOL).
- The LWML Kansas District is responsible for expenses incurred for the ongoing work of the committee.
- Although the responsibilities are great, so are the rewards! You will be strengthened in your spiritual walk; and, you will form deep and lasting friendships as you use your God-given gifts. Many of our current officers and committee members are employed outside the home; many hold offices and are also involved in their local LWML Groups and Zones.
- Talk this over with your family. Be in prayer. Discuss with a trusted friend or a District Officer.

Lutheran Woman's Quarterly and Web Maintenance Fee FAQ's payment due by April 1, 2025

Why make a Lutheran Woman's Quarterly (LWQ) payment?

The LWQ is sent out four times a year to each LWML local group that elects to receive them. They are sent by the LWML office in St. Louis. LWML sets the rates for each subscription a group receives. The current rates are \$6.00 each for 10 or more subscriptions and \$7.50 each for nine or fewer subscriptions. The LWML Kansas District is billed by LWML for the total amount of all the LWQ's the district receives. If an LWML group doesn't pay for the subscriptions it receives, the money to pay for the LWQ comes out of mite donations.

Why make the *LWQ* payment at this time?

The LWML office allows an LWML group to increase the number of subscriptions it wants to receive at any time during the year. However, decreases in the number of LWQ subscriptions a group wants is allowed only one time a year – in the spring. That is why there is a due date listed on the LWQ remittance form each group is asked to send with their payment. Payment by the requested date allows the LWML Kansas District to send the changes to the LWML office in St. Louis by their deadline date.

Why make a Web Maintenance Fee payment?

The web maintenance fee is a one-time yearly payment of \$10.00. Every LWML group in the Kansas District is asked to pay this fee. This fee helps pay the LWML Kansas District website hosting fee, website domain registration, and the website administrator's fee. The website has an abundance of useful information that each group, zone, and district leader can use and share with others to keep everyone informed. Check it out at *www.kansaslwml.org*.

Where is the form to send with the *LWQ* and/or Web Maintenance Fee payment?

The form may be found on the Organizational Resources page of the LWML Kansas District website, *www.kansaslwml.org.* The form is listed under the heading of "Forms". The form is also on the following page of this issue of *The Kansas Sonshine.*

Where is the payment sent?

Lutheran Woman's Quarterly and Web Maintenance Fee (2025) payments should be sent to the LWML Kansas District Distribution Manager. The Distribution Manager keeps track of how many *LWQ* subscriptions each LWML group has requested and of the *LWQ* and web maintenance fee payments made by each group.

All other payments such as mite offerings, Day of Prayer offerings, or donations should be sent to the LWML Kansas District Financial Secretary.

Thank you for making your 2025 *Lutheran Woman's Quarterly* and web maintenance fee payment on time. Remember – nonpayment by your LWML local group reduces our mite donations for missions.





It is with great joy that we invite you to ride the LWML Kansas District's charter bus to the 2025 Omaha Convention. We look forward to sharing this experience and time with you! The bus is scheduled to depart from Wichita on Wednesday, June 25, 2025 at 7:30 a.m. and will return to Kansas on Sunday, June 29, 2025. Stops in Salina and Topeka are included in the route.

To reserve a place on the bus, please complete the reservaton form and the participation release form. Mail these two forms along with a \$100 deposit to secure your seat on the bus. These are due to Travel Chairman Donna Smith by March 1, 2025. The deposit is NON-REFUNDABLE unless the bus is canceled. The remainder of the cost is due May 1, 2025.

The estimated price for the trip is \$648 for 2/room, \$528 for 3/room, or \$468 for 4/room, based on having 25 passengers. The price includes the bus cost, four (4) nights lodging, and gratuities for the bus driver and travel chairman. We don't anticipate the price being higher than these estimates, but it could be lower if we get more than 25 people. An itemized expense sheet will be provided with exact amounts as soon as possible after the hotel is booked.


