COUNSELOR'S CORNER Rev. John Werner | Pastoral Counselor

A Word from Pastor Werner:

Your Senior Pastoral Counselor was able to receive — and hopefully learn — some very helpful lessons early in his pastoral ministry.

This picture is from a past Sunday evening (almost ten years ago!). I was teaching confirmation at the Olson place and decided to come home via the "scenic" route. Unbeknownst to me, this route consisted of the famous "dirt roads of Marion County" that I had heard of so frequently.



Well, now I know. And I got stuck.

Here, I do want to say a public "thank you" to Ryan Olson who pulled me to a street I could drive on after I tried to do so on my own for a half hour. One lesson learned: it is good to have friends who own a Suburban!

Most of us have been stuck at one time or another. We experienced the death of someone close to us, or we had a serious fall, or we'd had it with the pressure of work or family. We know life isn't fair, and in spite of that, we sometimes get stuck. We love the Lord, but sometimes situations spiral us to a position that causes us to put our Bible reading aside. We go to church, but out of habit. We say a prayer of thanks before our meal, but we just become stuck in our relationship with the Lord.

Sarah and I were also struck with the remembrance of Queen Esther. She, too, found herself stuck in an uncommonly awkward and life-threatening position. She and her people had been sentenced to destruction by the evil Haman, and her husband, the king, was unaware of the particulars of Haman's plan. Yet for Esther to entreat the king's aid, she had to approach him, unrequested. And she knew that unless the king be merciful, anyone who dared approach the king in the inner court without being summoned would be killed.

So what did Queen Esther do? She and her maids fasted for three days and three nights, and requested that all other Jews do the same (cf. Esther 4:11-17).

Jesus, too, fasted with his disciples, even teaching them to not disfigure their faces *when* they fasted.

I am not saying fasting is required, nor is it always the answer. But that which is entwined with fasting: repentance, turning away from the world for a brief time, and dedicating oneself to prayer and reflection on God's Word — these gifts God gave us, and which Jesus Himself lived — can point us back to Him and reveal to us how to "unstuck" ourselves. During this Christmas season, we can look forward to feasting with friends and family in our homes and our churches in the "foretaste of the feast to come" in our heavenly home.

Praise God, we do not live in a vacuum here in time! Through the power and comfort of the Holy Spirit, we are blessed with a Christian community to uphold us in prayer, sustain us, and even pull us out of the mud — with their Suburban.



GOSPEL OUTREACH

It's a very special thing to sing the *Doxology* with LWML sisters recognizing God's grace in achieving funds for a mission grant. I often close my eyes just to soak in the beauty of the words and the harmonized voices of those who have used their hands and feet to collect their silver and gold for His will. What a beautiful experience.

So far this biennium, the LWML Kansas District Executive Committee (EC) has stood and sung the *Doxology* three times; meaning, we have already funded the first three mission grants for this biennium. Thanks be to God!

The LWML Kansas District Mission Grant/God's Gracious Gift Fund Applications for the 2026–2028 biennium will soon be available on the district website. There will be an electronic and a paper format available. The Gospel Outreach Committee has focused on improving the application form providing more clarity on how grant applications will be evaluated. This criterion is the same as that used by the (national) LWML Gospel Outreach Committee.

Each grant application will be evaluated by the following criteria:

- Be mission in emphasis, extending the ministry of the Word in other words, spread the Gospel.
- Fit into plans and projections of the LCMS in doctrinal agreement with the LCMS.
- Be current and ready for implementation once funding is received.
- Be ongoing in nature, with the assurance of continuing after the grant monies have been expended.
- Have clearly stated purpose so the Gospel Outreach committee can tell how the money will be used.
- Be submitted by an LWML Member, Group, Zone, District, or the LCMS Board for National Mission or the LCMS Board for International Mission.

Each grant goes through a rigorous review process by the Gospel Outreach Committee, the Kansas District LCMS Office, the LCMS Office in St. Louis, the LWML Kansas District Executive Board, and the LWML Kansas District Board of Directors.

The Mission Grant and God's Gracious Gift Fund applications are due September 1, 2025. The approved grant proposals for the 2026–2028 biennium will be voted on by the delegates at the 2026 LWML Kansas District Convention.




WOW! 2024 is behind us — that is clear; but what does 2025 have in store for us? As the Organizational Resources Committee is digging into the 2024–2026 biennium of zone bylaw reviews, we are focusing on clarity. Is the wording of your bylaws clear and concise? Does each article and section describe the current practice of your zone? Would someone not familiar with how your zone operates be able to read your bylaws and find the guidance they need? There are some zone current practices that are less

clear in the bylaws but everyone just knows, "It's how it's always been done." We have all heard that before! It is just fine if it has always been done that way, but please include it in your bylaws or standing rules for all to know.

The Organizational Resources Committee suggests that you have someone unfamiliar with your bylaws and standing rules to read through them. Have them make note of what items are unclear or could be worded differently to provide clarity. Also have someone who is experienced in the zone and familiar with the bylaws, recommend wording that leaves no question as to what is meant.

As we encourage new people to become involved in LWML, it is important that we provide them with clear guidance so they can feel comfortable and confident in the resources available to them as they grow in God's grace.



We look forward to sharing the bus experience and time with you! The bus is scheduled to depart from Wichita on Wednesday, June 25, 2025, at 7:30 a.m. and will return to Kansas on Sunday, June 29. Stops in Salina, Topeka, and Fairview, are included in the route.

To reserve YOUR place on the bus, please complete the reservation form and the participation release form *(found on pages 10–11 of this document)*. Mail these two forms along with a \$100 deposit to secure your seat. These are due to Travel Chairman Donna Smith by **March 1, 2025**. The deposit is NON-REFUNDABLE unless the bus is canceled. The remainder of the cost is due May 1, 2025.

The estimated price for the trip is \$648 for 2/room, \$528 for 3/room, or \$468 for 4/room, based on **25** passengers. The price includes the bus cost, four (4) nights lodging, and gratuities for the bus driver and travel chairman. We don't anticipate the price being higher than these estimates, but it could be lower if we have more than 25 people. An itemized expense sheet will be provided with exact amounts as soon as possible after the hotel is booked. *In order to get these prices, we need at least 25 people to make a reservation by the deadline of March 1.*

For your convenience the LWML Kansas District Executive Committee has included a gratuity for the bus driver and the travel chairman in the price of the trip. If you feel you would like to tip an additional amount at the end of the trip, there will be an opportunity to do so.

All meals and convention registration fees are your responsibility. When you register for the convention, you will be given the opportunity to book your hotel. <u>DO NOT book a hotel through the convention registration! The travel chairman will book your hotel for you.</u>



LWML KANSAS DISTRICT ZONE AND LOCAL GROUP NEWS

The **LINCOLN ZONE** Fall Workshop was held at First Lutheran Church in Plainville, on Saturday morning, October 12, with 28 in attendance. The Bible Study was led by Zone Counselor Pastor Chris Craig, focusing on the hymn, *Abide With Me*. Gifts from the Heart was collected for Plainville's Suitcase Project for foster children. Our special guest for the day was LWML Kansas District President Elaine Engelman. Everyone enjoyed the day with a wonderful salad luncheon, followed by singing, a skit, drawings, mite offering, and the zone business meeting.



On Wednesday, October 23, seven ladies from the LINCOLN **ZONE** enjoyed a road trip to the Orphan Grain Train Warehouse in Wichita. Attending from Trinity, Hunter were Beverly Wiese, Ann Heller, Jayne Heller, Pam Schneider, Marilyn Schneider, and Becky Keller. Shelly Keller attended from Bethlehem, Sylvan Grove. They travelled together to deliver guilts, school kits, and health kits that had been assembled by their LWML groups. Fifty quilts made by the LWML Group of St. John, Lincoln, were also delivered. The ladies provided a sandwich luncheon for all the workers at the warehouse. After lunch, the ladies helped pack boxes of health kits, after first checking all the kits to be sure they had the correct supplies inside. The boxes were packed, taped, and labeled, and then put with the other boxes of health kits in the store room; they will be sent to those in need. The Wichita site sent a container the previous week to Ukraine, filled with many supplies and kits, medical equipment, bicycles, and clothing. The cost of that shipment was \$16,000, indicating how they rely on generous donors for shipping funding, as well as donating the needed items and kits.
